








→Yet there's a \$700 billion annual funding gap to protect and restore biodiversity.




Thailand's spending on biodiversity has dropped from 0.53% of total government expenditures in 2016 to 0.36% in 2023.

Support local government in developing legal framework and issuing the Municipality Ordinance



20 Baht tourist user fees supports coral reefs preservation



Revenue from user fees contributes to Fiscal Budgeting



Official Environmental Working Group supports local communities via Koh Tao Environmental Funds
